## Dear Madam Chairwoman:

As a candidate seeking to become eligible to receive Presidential primary matching funds, I certify and agree to the following provisions as prescribed at 11 CFR §9033.1 and 11 CFR §9033.2.

- I. In accordance with 11 CFR §9033.2(b)(1) and 11 CFR §9033.2(b)(3), I certify that I am:
  - a. seeking the nomination of the Green Party of the United States for election to the Office of President in more than one State. The nominating convention of the Green Party of the United States is from July 12 - July 15, 2012;
  - seeking the nomination of one unaffiliated state Green Party with a ballot line.
     That unaffiliated state Green Party is in Utah. Per Utah Code 20A-8-106(5)(a), presidential/VP nominees must be submitted by August 15, 2012;
  - c. seeking the nomination of several unaffiliated state Green Parties without ballot lines. Those unaffiliated state Green Parties, which designate nominees using the applicable state's independent candidate petitioning deadlines as their cutoff dates for formal nominations, are:
    - i. Alabama (independent candidate petitioning deadline: September 6, 2012);
    - ii. Kansas (independent candidate petitioning deadline: August 6, 2012);
    - iii. New Hampshire (independent candidate petitioning deadline: August 8, 2012)(additionally, I may seek the nomination of New Hampshire's Socialist Alternative Party. That same August 8, 2012 independent candidate petitioning deadline would be applicable):
    - iv. South Dakota (independent candidate petitioning deadline: August 7, 2012);
  - d. seeking the nomination of the Green New Deal-Party (a new political party for which recognition is being sought in the applicable states) in several states, where I am also attempting to petition onto the ballot using that state's independent candidate petitioning deadlines. Those states are:
    - i. Idaho (independent candidate petitioning deadline: August 31, 2012);
    - ii. Missouri (independent candidate petitioning deadline: July 30, 2012);

- e. attempting to petition onto the ballot as an independent candidate in several states, using that state's independent candidate petitioning deadlines. Those states are:
  - i. Montana (independent candidate petitioning deadline: August 1, 2012);
  - ii. North Dakota (independent candidate petitioning deadline: September 7, 2012);
  - iii. Wyoming (independent candidate petitioning deadline: August 28, 2012);
- f. seeking the nomination of the Progressive Party in Vermont using that state's independent candidate petitioning deadline: September 20, 2012.

I and/or my authorized committee(s) have received matchable contributions, which in the aggregate exceed \$5,000 from residents of each of at least twenty States, which with respect to any one person do not exceed \$250.00.

- II. Pursuant to 11 CFR §9033.2(b)(2), I and/or my authorized committee(s) have not incurred and will not incur qualified campaign expenses in excess of the expenditure limitations prescribed by 26 U.S.C. §9035 and 11 CFR §9035.
- III. In accordance with 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(1), I acknowledge that I have the burden of proving that disbursements made by me, and any of my authorized committee(s) or agents are qualified campaign expenses as defined at 11 CFR §9032.9.
- IV. Pursuant to 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(2), I and my authorized committee(s) will comply with the documentation requirements set forth in 11 CFR §9033.11.
- V. Upon the request of the Commission, I and my authorized committee(s) will supply an explanation of the connection between any disbursement made by me or my authorized committee(s) and the campaign as prescribed by 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(3).
- VI. In accordance with 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(4), I and my authorized committee(s) agree to keep and furnish to the Commission all documentation for matching fund submissions, any books, records (including bank records for all accounts) and supporting documentation and other information that the Commission may request.
- VII. As provided at 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(5), I and my authorized committee(s) agree to keep and furnish to the Commission all documentation relating to disbursements and receipts including any books, records (including bank records for all accounts), all documentation required by this section (including those required to be maintained under 11 CFR §9033.11), and other information that the Commission may request. If I or my authorized committee(s) maintains or uses computerized information containing any of the categories of data listed in 11 CFR §9033.12(a), the committee will provide computerized magnetic media, such as magnetic tapes or magnetic diskettes, containing the computerized information at the times specified in 11 CFR §9038.1(b)(1) that meet the requirements of 11 CFR §9033.12(b). Upon request, documentation explaining the

computer system's software capabilities shall be provided and such personnel as are necessary to explain the operation of the computer system's software and the computerized information prepared or maintained by the committee(s) shall be made available.

- VIII. As prescribed at 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(6), I and my authorized committee(s) will obtain and furnish to the Commission upon request all documentation relating to funds received and disbursements made on my behalf by other political committees and organizations associated with me.
- IX. In accordance with 26 U.S.C. §9038 and 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(7), I and my authorized committee(s) shall permit an audit and examination pursuant to 11 CFR §9038 of all receipts and disbursements, including those made by me, all authorized committee(s) and any agent or person authorized to make expenditures on my behalf or on behalf of my authorized committee(s). I and my authorized committee(s) shall also provide any material required in connection with an audit, investigation, or examination conducted pursuant to 11 CFR §9039. I and my authorized committee(s) shall facilitate the audit by making available in one central location, office space, records and such personnel as are necessary to conduct the audit and examination, and shall pay any amounts required to be repaid under 11 CFR §9038 and 11 CFR §9039.
- X. Pursuant to 11 CFR §9033.1(b)(8), the person listed below is entitled to receive matching fund payments on my behalf, which will be deposited into the listed depository, which I have designated as the campaign depository.
