**SUBJECT:** Status of Enforcement – Fiscal Year 2023, Second Quarter (01/01/23-03/31/23)

To assist the Commission and the Office of General Counsel in assessing the current productivity of the Commission's enforcement program, we submit the Status of Enforcement for the Second Quarter of Fiscal Year 2023 (01/01/23-03/31/23). The tables that follow provide information to assist agency management in its review of the enforcement program.

In summary, at the close of the quarter, the total caseload was 184 matters — 96 active and 88 inactive. During the quarter, the Enforcement Division circulated First General Counsel's Reports ("FGCRs") in 19 matters in an average of 142 days, meeting the internal circulation goal 74% of the time. The Enforcement Division's Office of Complaints Examination & Legal Administration ("CELA") circulated 2 EPS reports this quarter. There were 13 matters pending in the investigation stage at the close of the quarter. There were also 46 case closings and the Commission assessed \$323,500 in civil penalties.
