Dear Mr. Reiff and Mr. Sandler:

The Federal Election Commission ("Commission") has ascertained information in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities indicating that your clients Sheila Jackson Lee for Congress and Karen Grays, in her official capacity as treasurer ("Committee"), may have violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). Following an audit conducted by the Commission pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30111(b), the Committee has been referred by the Audit Division to the Commission's Office of General Counsel for possible enforcement action under 52 U.S.C. § 30109.¹ Specifically, the Committee has been referred for misstatement of financial activity in the amount of \$120,605; Calendar Year 2020; receipt of contributions in excess of the limit totaling \$129,600; Calendar Years 2019 and 2029; and receipt of apparent prohibited contributions totaling \$10,450; Calendar Years 2019 and 2020. We have numbered this referral AR 23-02.

The Act affords you the opportunity to demonstrate in writing that no action should be taken against your clients Shelia Jackson Lee for Congress and Karen Grays in her official capacity as treasurer in this matter. If you wish to file a response, you may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath by persons with relevant knowledge. Your response, which should be addressed to the General Counsel's Office, must be submitted within 15 days of receipt of this letter. If no response is received within 15 days, the Commission may take further action based on the available information.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(B) and § 30109(a)(12)(A) unless you notify the Commission in writing that you wish the matter to be made public. Please be advised that, although the Commission cannot disclose information regarding an investigation to the public, it may share information on a confidential basis with other law enforcement agencies, including the Department of Justice.² While the matter remains open, it will

The Commission has the statutory authority to refer knowing and willful violations of the Act to the Department of Justice for potential criminal prosecution, 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(5)(C), and to report information regarding violations of law not within its jurisdiction to appropriate law enforcement authorities. *Id.* § 30107(a)(9).
