WASHINGTON -- Mr. Stanley Kusper, Jr., County Clerk of Cook County, Ill., and Mr. William F. Huish, County Clerk of Utah County, Utah, have been named to two-year terms on the Advisory Panel of the Federal Election Commission's National Clearinghouse on Election Administration.

FEC Chairman Robert O. Tiernan said the terms of the new panel members will run from October 1, 1979, through September 30, 1981. They fill vacancies in the 22 member Panel created by expiration of the memberships of Joan Demus, County Clerk and Recorder of Marion County, W. Va., and Tom Malone, Supervisor of Elections of Fulton County, Ga. "As members of our Advisory Panel, Mr. Kusper and Mr. Huish will help advise the Commission of the best ways to use its resources to help improve the administration of elections throughout the Nation," Chairman Tiernan stated. He expressed his appreciation for the services of the outgoing members.

Dr. Gary Greenhalgh, Director of the Clearinghouse, has announced that the Advisory Panel will hold a one-day meeting on Thursday, October 11, in Washington.
