

# FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION



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WASHINGTON -- Chairman Lillian "Midge" Trainor of the Burlington County Board of Elections met Tuesday in Washington with officials of the Federal Election Commission to discuss election-related topics.

Of prime interest to her was information and services available to the Burlington County Board of Elections through the Commission's National Clearinghouse for Election Administration.

Topics discussed included: new election technology; improved training methods, procedures and workshops available for elections officials and staff of the Burlington County election office; and new research reports and projects on elections management that might be of assistance to the County Board of Elections.

The National Clearinghouse for Election Administration was created by Congress to enable the FEC to conduct research in the administration of elections for Federal offices, and to make reports and recommendations generated by those studies available to state and local elections officials. The FEC has created a 22-member Advisory Panel of local and state election administrators and officials from throughout the country to advise and assist the Clearinghouse in carrying out its missions.
