FEC TO HOLD SPECIAL MEETING ON PROPOSED REGULATIONS

WASHINGTON - The Federal Election Commission has announced that it will hold a special public meeting to discuss proposed regulations on communications by corporations and labor organizations.

The special meeting will be held at 2:00 p.m. Tuesday, January 26, in the Commission meeting room on the fifth floor, 1325 K Street, N.W., Washington, D.C.

In October 1981, the FEC held public hearings on the subject of corporate and labor communications. Representatives of interested parties testified at those hearings on the proposed changes to 11 C.F.R. 114.3 and 114.4 of the FEC Regulations. Numerous written comments were also received.

Tuesday's meeting will be held to discuss revisions to staff drafts of the regulations. Discussion may continue on Thursday, January 28, if necessary.

Once finalized by the FEC, the regulations must be sent to Congress where either the Senate or House may veto them.
