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REGIONAL CONFERENCES TO DISCUSS ELECTION LAWS, ELECTION PROCEDURES

WASHINGTON -- Anyone interested in the Federal election process will have an opportunity to learn about the latest developments in election laws through a series of five regional conferences to be held by the Federal Election Commission this year between September and December.

Workshops will be of interest to Federal candidates, state and local political party officials, representatives from political action committees, state legislators and staff, attorneys, accountants, election officials and others interested in the election process.

General subject areas to be discussed in workshops and roundtable discussions are: corporate and labor activity; federal candidates and their committees; political party activity in federal elections; nonconnected political action committees; and areas of general interest, such as Presidential elections, FEC enforcement, tax issues and the use of campaign finance reports.

Campaign finance conferences will be run in conjunction with regional conferences on election administration.

The regional conferences will be held between September and December as follows:

- Midwest Regional -- Itasca (Chicago area), September 6-8
- Northeast Regional -- Albany, N.Y., September 25-27
- Southern Regional -- Charleston, S.C., October 23-25
- Southwest Regional -- Tulsa, Okla., November 13-15
- Far West Regional -- Los Angeles, December 4-6
