FEC RELEASES 1991 MID-YEAR PAC COUNT

WASHINGTON -- The total number of registered political action committees fell to 4,123 - its lowest level in four years, according to a semi-annual survey taken July 1, 1991, by the Federal Election Commission.

The recorded overall decrease of 49 registered PACs since December 31, 1990, was fueled by a net loss of 50 corporation sponsored committees and occurred despite a net gain of 34 non-connected PACs. Registration activity among the other categories included: labor, -7; trade/membership/health, -25; cooperative, -2; and corporation without stock, +1.

Corporate PACs remained the largest category with 1,745 committees, followed by non-connected, 1,096; trade/membership/health, 749; labor, 339; corporation without stock, 137; and cooperative, 57.

Non-connected PACs, which are not candidate or party committees, must register and report to the FEC when financial activity exceeds \$1,000 during a calendar year. Connected PACs must register when established.

A caution - this release concerns a count of only federally registered PACs and registration does not necessarily imply financial activity.
