By comparison, in 1992 the first matching fund payments went to eight candidates totaling \$6,372,788.31; in 1988, 12 candidates received a total of \$28,748,261.05; in 1984, six candidates received a total of \$7,771,960.41; in 1980, three candidates received a total of \$1,944,055.92; and in 1976, 11 candidates were paid \$1,880,502.21.
