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CAMPAIGN CITED FOR FAILURE TO FILE PRE-CONVENTION REPORT

WASHINGTON -- Connecticut will hold a convention on July 20, 1996, to select Republican nominees for the 4th and 5th Congressional Districts.

As of 5 p.m., July 16, 1996, a disclosure report from the following committee had not been filed:

CT/05...FRIENDS FOR FRANKS (1996)...MARITA T. THOMPSON, TREAS...GARY A. FRANKS...REP

Reports were due July 8, 1996, and should have included financial activity for the period April 1, 1996, through June 30, 1996. If sent by certified or registered mail, the reports should have been postmarked by midnight July 5, 1996.

Committees were notified of their filing requirements on June 14, 1996. Those committees which did not file on the due date were notified on July 9, 1996, that reports had not been received and that their names would be published if they did not respond within four business days.

The Commission publishes only the names of those committees which have been designated by candidates as their principal campaign committees. Other political committees supporting Senate and House candidates (those which are not authorized units of a candidate's campaign) file either quarterly or monthly reports. Those committees are not published by the FEC.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers is decided on a case-by-case basis. Federal law gives the FEC broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for "any violation" and \$10,000 for any "knowing and willful" violation.)

The next regularly scheduled disclosure report for these congressional committees will be the quarterly report due October 15, 1996. It will cover activity through September 30.

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
