SUBJECT: Reason To Believe Recommendation – 2022 Year-End Report for the
Administrative Fine Program

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to file the 2022 Year-End Report in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). The Year-End Report was due on January 31, 2023.

The committees listed in the attached RTB Circulation Report either failed to file the report, filed the report no more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a late filed report), or filed the report more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a non-filed report). In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached circulation report.

In order to determine the level of activity for unauthorized quarterly filers that filed a Year-End Report and were required to but failed to file the 30-Day Post-General Report, the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) used the following procedures and criteria:

- Every Year-End Report (YE) submitted by an unauthorized quarterly filer that covered the period from October 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 (92 days) was reviewed for activity which would have required the filing of a 30-Day Post-General Report (30G Report). If our research indicated that a 30G was required, we utilized a three-step method to arrive at the activity on which to base the YE fine amount. First, we took the sum of all itemized receipts and disbursements that should have been disclosed on a YE that covered the period from November 29, 2022 through December 31, 2022 (33 days). Second, if the committee had any unitemized activity, a per diem level of this activity was calculated by multiplying the total amount of unitemized activity on the report by 35.87% (33 days (correct YE Filing Period)/92 days (submitted YE Filing Period)). Third, we took the sum of the amounts calculated in steps one and two to arrive at the level of activity assigned to the YE.

Recommendation

1. Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers, in their official capacity, listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and make a preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.
2. Send the appropriate letters.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file a Year-End Report of Receipts and Disbursements every calendar year. This report, covering the period November 29, 2022 through December 31, 2022, shall be filed no later than January 31, 2023. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). Because records at the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission" or "FEC") indicate that you did not file this report within thirty (30) days of the due date, the report is considered not filed for the purpose of calculating the civil money penalty.

The Act permits the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4). On March 31, 2023, the Commission found that there is reason to believe ("RTB") that Karen Green for Florida and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) by failing to file timely this report on or before January 31, 2023. Based on the FEC's schedules of civil money penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$1,450. Please see the attached copy of the Commission's administrative fine regulations at 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.30-111.55. Attachment 1. The FEC's website contains further information about how the administrative fine program works and how the fines are calculated. See <https://www.fec.gov/af/af.shtml>. 11 C.F.R. § 111.34. Your payment of \$1,450 is due within forty (40) days of the finding, or by May 10, 2023, and is based on these factors:

Election Sensitivity of Report: Not Election Sensitive

Level of Activity: \$48,768

Number of Days Late: Not Filed (reports not filed within thirty (30) days of the due date are considered not filed for the purpose of calculating the penalty)

Number of Previous Civil Money Penalties Assessed: 0

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At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

1. If You Choose to Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you decide to challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must email a written response to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review at administrativefines@fec.gov. Your response must include the AF# (found at the top of page 1 under your committee's identification number) and be received within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, or May 10, 2023. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(a). Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty and must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(c).

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three factors: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). For a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. *Id.* Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite your seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; (2) a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by a failure of the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and (3) severe weather or other disaster-related incident. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(c). Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) negligence; (2) delays caused by vendors or contractors; (3) treasurer and staff illness, inexperience or unavailability; (4) committee computer, software, or Internet service provider failures; (5) failure to know filing dates; and (6) failure to use filing software properly. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d).

If you fail to timely raise a factual argument in your challenge to the RTB finding, your right to present such an argument in an appeal to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109 shall be deemed waived. 11 C.F.R. § 111.38.

It should also be noted that all challenges to an RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty should be converted to PDF (Portable Document Format) and emailed to administrativefines@fec.gov. The Commission encourages the use of electronic signatures on electronically submitted documents, but scanned copies of ink signatures

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will be accepted. Electronically submitted challenges will be deemed received on the date they are electronically received by staff.

In addition, if you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address, and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Submit a Challenge

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, the FEC will conclude that the factual allegations underlying the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty are true and make a final determination that Karen Green for Florida and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701, et seq. The Commission may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 C.F.R. § 111.51(a)(2).

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you decide to pay the calculated civil money penalty, please follow the payment instructions below. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

You may remit payment by Automated Clearinghouse ("ACH") withdrawal from your bank account, or by debit or credit card through Pay.gov, the federal government's secure portal for online collections. Visit <https://www.fec.gov/af/pay.shtml> to be directed to Pay.gov's Administrative Fine Program Payment form. Please use the details at the top of this letter to complete the required fields.

Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that

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the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.

Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission will be rejected. This includes making a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

SUBJECT: Administrative Fine Program – Final Determination Recommendation for the 2022 Year-End Report

Attached are two lists of political committees and their treasurers against which the Commission has found reason to believe (RTB) and assessed proposed civil money penalties calculated at RTB for failure to file or failure to timely file the 2022 Year-End Report. The first list represents the committees that have paid the civil money penalty and the second list represents the committees that have not paid the civil money penalty. The committees that have not paid have been given at least forty (40) days from the date of the Commission's RTB finding to remit payment.

In accordance with 11 CFR § 111.34 and 11 CFR § 111.40, the Commission shall send a final determination notice to those respondents that have either paid or not paid the civil money penalty.

Please note, the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) recommends that the Commission take no further action against Support American Leaders PAC (AF 4629). On May 19, 2023, June 28, 2023, and October 31, 2023, respectively, the Commission approved the recommendations to take no further action against the Committee for failing to file the 2022 July Quarterly Report (AF 4378), 2022 October Quarterly Report (AF 4461), and 2022 30-Day Post-General Report (AF 4553). This recommendation aligns with prior Commission actions which have allowed for the

exclusion and removal of defunct committees. Please see the detailed explanation below to support this recommendation.

Support American Leaders PAC was the subject of five (5) Administrative Fine matters in which the Committee was assessed civil money penalties totaling \$76,500 (AF cases 3828, 3900, 3950, 4187, and 4319). The Committee paid \$55 towards these fines and all cases have been transferred to the U. S. Department of the Treasury (“Treasury”) for collection.

The last report filed by the Committee was the 2021 Year-End Report on January 4, 2022, disclosing an ending cash-on-hand balance of negative \$267,554.80. The Committee has not responded to Commission requests to file missing reports. Further, the Committee’s Treasurer, Matthew Tunstall, was recently convicted on charges related to the operation of this PAC.¹

For your information, thirty-eight (38) committees disclosed a level of activity after the RTB finding which would result in a lowered civil money penalty. An overview of these cases has been provided below.

Agoda4Congress (AF 4565) filed the 2022 Year-End Report on paper after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$2,737 (previously estimated to be \$74,533), thus the fine would be lowered from \$4,624 to \$402.

Alex Bryant for Congress (AF 4566) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$109,167), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$7,708).

Angel for Maryland (AF 4568) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$94,793), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$5,994).

Asensio4Congress (AF 4569) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$9,614 (previously estimated to be \$36,272), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,450 to \$483.

Attica Scott for Congress (AF 4570) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$80,170), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$5,994).

Christian for Congress (AF 4573) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$111 (previously estimated to be \$104,567), thus the fine would be lowered from \$7,708 to \$111.

Christine for Congress (AF 4574) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$26,929), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,450).

Committee to Elect Ann Marie Danimus (AF 4576) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$5,704 (previously estimated to be \$62,710), thus the fine would be lowered from \$4,624 to \$483.

Coram for Colorado (AF 4578) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$76 (previously estimated to be \$155,502), thus the fine would be lowered from \$9,420 to \$76.

Dr. Richard Watkins for Senate (AF 4580) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$30,772), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,450).

E M Krause Committee to Elect 4 NV (AF 4581) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$1,500 (previously estimated to be \$25,729), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,450 to \$402.

First for America (AF 4584) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$7,813 (previously estimated to be \$72,325), thus the fine would be lowered from \$4,624 to \$483.

Fort for Congress (AF 4585) filed the 2022 Year-End Report on paper after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$988 (previously estimated to be \$76,569), thus the fine would be lowered from \$5,994 to \$402.

Friends of Barbara Sharief for Congress (AF 4586) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$0 (previously estimated to be \$339,332), thus the fine would be lowered from \$17,127 to \$0.

Friends of Cindy Banyai (AF 4588) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$211 (previously estimated to be \$22,517), thus the fine would be lowered from \$806 to \$211.

Friends of Jahmal Cole (AF 4589) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$44,816), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,450).

Friends of Jason Mariner (AF 4590) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$84,777), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$7,492).

Gashi for Congress (AF 4592) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$18,164 (previously estimated to be \$439,161), thus the fine would be lowered from \$15,414 to \$806.

Harbin for Georgia, Inc (AF 4596) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$0 (previously estimated to be \$248,362), thus the fine would be lowered from \$11,132 to \$0.

Hausman for Congress (AF 4597) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$0 (previously estimated to be \$53,525), thus the fine would be lowered from \$4,624 to \$0.

Jones, Herb (US House) (AF 4598) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$10,317 (previously estimated to be \$113,398), thus the fine would be lowered from \$7,708 to \$806.

Holden for Congress (AF 4599) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$5,203 (previously estimated to be \$37,713), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,450 to \$483. Note, the Committee filed a 2022 Year-End Report (YE) covering October 20, 2022 through December 31, 2022 (73 days), but they were only required to file a 2022 Year-End Report covering November 29, 2022 through December 31, 2022 (33 days). In order to arrive at the activity on which to base the YE fine amount we utilized a three-step method. First, we took the sum of all itemized receipts and disbursements that were disclosed during the required filing dates. Second, if the committee had any unitemized activity, a per diem level of this activity was calculated by multiplying the total amount of unitemized activity on the report by 45% (33 days (Committee's Required YE Filing Period)/73 days (Committee's Reported YE Filing Period)). Third, we took the sum of the amounts calculated in steps one and two to arrive at the level of activity assigned to the YE.

Ian Smith for Congress (AF 4601) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$86,797), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$ 5,994).

Iroghama Omere for TX (AF 4602) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$119,066), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$7,708).

Jessica Taylor for Senate Inc. (AF 4603) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money

The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$388 (previously estimated to be \$47,231), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,450 to \$388.

Kutz for Congress (AF 4612) filed a Termination Report, which covered the 2022 Year-End reporting period, after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$0 (previously estimated to be \$39,443), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,450 to \$0.

Local 891 International Union of Operating Engineers Engineers Political Education Committee (AF 4615) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$4,410 (previously estimated to be \$23,891), thus the fine would be lowered from \$806 to \$402.

Michelle Beckley for Congress (AF 4616) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$98,420), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$7,492).

Murphy for WI (AF 4619) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$74,132), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$4,624).

Palmer for Illinois (AF 4621) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$70,532), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$4,624).

Paul Steury for Congress (AF 4623) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$9,499 (previously estimated to be \$32,749), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,450 to \$483.

Rett for Senate (AF 4626) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$0 (previously estimated to be \$58,323), thus the fine would be lowered from \$4,624 to \$0.

Roberts for Congress (AF 4627) filed the 2022 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that

assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$0 (previously estimated to be \$334,345), thus the fine would be lowered from \$13,702 to \$0.

Suzi4Georgia (AF 4630) filed a Termination Report, which covered the 2022 Year-End reporting period, after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$265 (previously estimated to be \$45,677), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,450 to \$265.

Women Vote Smart (AF 4637) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$145,616), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$23,124).

Yu for Senate (AF 4638) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$85,516), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$5,994).

On March 31, 2023, the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission" or "FEC") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Karen Green for Florida and you, in your official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for filing late or failing to file the 2022 Year-End Report. By letter dated April 3, 2023, the Commission notified you of the RTB finding and the civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage to be \$1,450, in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. Within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, you, in your official capacity as treasurer, were required to either transmit payment of the calculated civil money penalty or submit a written response challenging either the RTB finding or the calculated civil money penalty.

The FEC did not receive payment of the calculated civil money penalty or a written response within the time permitted. The Commission made a final determination on November 16, 2023 that Karen Green for Florida and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed a civil money penalty in the amount of \$1,450, in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. The civil money penalty is based on these factors:

Election Sensitivity of Report: Not Election Sensitive

Level of Activity: \$48,768

Number of Days Late: Not Filed (reports not filed within thirty (30) days of the due date are considered not filed for the purposes of calculating the penalty)

Number of Previous Civil Money Penalties Assessed: 0

At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

KAREN GREEN FOR FLORIDA

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1. If You Choose to Appeal the Final Determination and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you choose to appeal the final determination, you must submit a written petition, within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter, to the U.S. District Court for the district in which the committee or you reside or transact business, requesting that the final determination be modified or set aside. See 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(C)(iii). If you did not timely raise a factual argument in a challenge to the Commission's RTB finding, your right to present such an argument in an appeal to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109 shall be deemed waived. 11 C.F.R. § 111.38.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Appeal

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 ("DCIA"), 31 U.S.C. § 3701, et seq. If you do not pay this debt within thirty (30) days and do not appeal the Commission's final determination to the U.S. District Court (see above), the Commission will transfer the debt to the U.S. Department of the Treasury ("Treasury") for collection. Treasury will contact you to request payment within five (5) days of receiving the debt. Treasury currently charges a fee of 30% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. If the age of the debt is greater than or equal to two years old, Treasury will charge a fee of 32% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. The fee will be added to the amount of the civil money penalty that you owe. Should Treasury's attempts fail, Treasury will refer the debt to a private collection agency. If the debt remains unpaid, Treasury may recommend that the Commission refer the matter to the Department of Justice for litigation.

Actions which may be taken to enforce recovery of a delinquent debt by Treasury may also include: (1) offset of any payments, which the debtor is due, including tax refunds and salary; (2) referral of the debt to agency counsel for litigation; (3) reporting of the debt to a credit bureau; (4) administrative wage garnishment; and (5) reporting of the debt, if discharged, to the IRS as potential taxable income. In addition, under the provisions of DCIA and other statutes applicable to the FEC, the debtor may be subject to the assessment of other statutory interest, penalties, and administrative costs.

In accordance with the DCIA, at your request, the agency will offer you the opportunity to inspect and copy records relating to the debt, the opportunity for a review of the debt, and the opportunity to enter into a written repayment agreement.

Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

The confidentiality provisions at 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.42(b) and 111.20(c), the file will be placed on the public record within thirty (30) days from the date of this notification.
