RE: Request for an Advisory Opinion

This letter is a response to a letter sent to me, Theodore Schlagel, Treasurer, Green Party of Washington State (GPoWS), by your staff Adriane Lavender dated September 20, 2000 (see Attachment 1) and the letter from yourself dated October 12, 2000 (see Attachment 2). As I understand these letters, I, as the Treasurer of GPoWS, am required to request an advisory opinion from the FEC regarding GPoWS standing/status as the state committee for the Green Party of Washington State. It is up to the FEC to determine by issuing an Advisory Opinion whether the GPoWS is in fact the state committee for the Green Party of Washington State.

In light of this, I have reviewed the FEC Record and talked with your staff to determine what I must do to proceed. I contacted Adriane on 10/5/00 and was advised to talk to the FEC Information Division. I then talked to a "Ted" in the FEC Information Division on 10/5/00 and was advised to download the Brochure on Advisory Opinions from the FEC web site. Ted also advised me to review the FEC Record for past relevant Advisory Opinions, specifically AO 1999-26, AO 1998-27, AO 1998-24, AO 1998-2, AO 1997-29, AO 1997-7, AO 1997-3, AO 1996-51, AO 1996-43 and AO 1996-27. As I am sure you are aware, these Advisory Opinions present a consistent pattern regarding what is required to demonstrate that a state party qualifies as a State Party Committee.

First, by definition (from AO 1999-26), "the FEC Act defines a state committee as 'the organization which, by virtue of the bylaws of a political party, is responsible for the day-to-day operation of such political party at the state level, as determined by the commission'". I have included the GPoWS state charter (see Attachment 3) and articles of incorporation (see Attachment 4) and bylaws (see Attachment 5). These documents show that GPoWS is chartered and incorporated within Washington State. The bylaws show that GPoWS is statewide in membership (3.1), holds state conventions (4.1.B), has elected officials (4.1.A), is a legal entity (4.1.D), has a governing body with regular meetings (4.1.D) and nominates and/or endorses federal and state candidates (5).

According to AO 1999-26, "In a number of Advisory Opinions, the FEC has identified two requirements necessary for state political committee status".

"First, the organization must have a state affiliate agreement that delineates activities commensurate with the day-to-day operation of a party at a state level". The GPoWS bylaws is such a documented state affiliate agreement, voted on and adopted at the 5/13/00 state convention. The bylaws delineate activities commensurate with the day-to-day operation of a party at a state level.


"Second, the state affiliate must gain ballot access for its federal candidates. The state party's candidate must qualify as a candidate under FEC regulations in order for the party to satisfy this second requirement. The FEC has made clear that a state political party can qualify as a state party committee without an affiliation with a national political party". The GPoWS has nominated several candidates for federal office. These people have run as candidates of the Green Party. These candidates have been on the primary elections ballot in Washington State, received more than 1% of the total votes cast and are on the ballot for the general elections of Washington State on November 7, 2000. All of these candidates satisfy FEC requirements for establishing themselves as federal candidates under 2 USC 431(2). These candidates include Ralph Nader, for US President, Winona LaDuke, for US Vice President and Joe Szwaja for US Congressman, 7th District. I have included printouts from the Washington State Government web page on 2000 general election candidates (showing that these federal candidates have ballot access in Washington State). This information is in the public domain and can be directly verified by the FEC (see Attachment 6).

Please note the GPoWS is not formally affiliated with either of the two national Green Parties but maintains informal contact with both as well as with the Nader National campaign. Nader has publicly acknowledged his nomination by GPoWS and the support he has received from the GPoWS towards his election campaign at the September 23, 2000 event at the Key Arena in Seattle Washington.

For these reasons, I believe that the GPoWS has met all of the requirements that the FEC set out regarding requirements to obtain State Party Committee status. I therefore request that the GPoWS be formally granted State Party Committee status for Washington State.

A written response or an amendment to your original report(s) correcting the above problem(s) should be filed with the Federal Election Commission within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter. Any response submitted by your committee will be placed on the public record and will be considered by the Commission prior to taking enforcement action.

TEN KEY VALUES OF THE GREENS

1. ECOLOGICAL WISDOM

We are part of nature and must not destroy it lest we destroy ourselves.

2. GRASSROOTS DEMOCRACY

Developing systems that will allow us to control the decisions that affect our lives.

3. PERSONAL AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Taking responsibility for what happens in our own community: education, crime, poverty, health.

4. NONVIOLENCE

Using non-violent methods to oppose practices with which we disagree.

5. DECENTRALIZATION

Returning autonomy to individuals, and to local institutions, communities, and regions.

6. COMMUNITY-BASED ECONOMICS

Encouraging workplace democracy and basic economic security for all, and recognising the importance of work done outside the formal monetary economy such as housekeeping, gardening, volunteer work, parenting.

7. POSTPATRIARCHAL VALUES/ECO-FEMINISM

Ending the domination of people by people, and encouraging respect for all people and their feelings and beliefs.

8. RESPECT FOR DIVERSITY

Honoring human cultural, ethnic, racial, sexual, religious and spiritual diversity.

9. GLOBAL RESPONSIBILITY

Helping all people to achieve autonomy. Realizing that our actions at home affect others worldwide.

10. FUTURE FOCUS

Inducing people and institutions to think in terms of the long range future, not just of their own immediate interests.

Bylaws of the Green Party of Washington State (Adopted May 13, 2000)

ARTICLE I. NAME

1.1 Name - The name of this organization shall be the Green Party of Washington State.

ARTICLE II. FUNCTION OF THE ORGANIZATION

2.1 Function Statement - The function of this organization shall be to work towards a Green society as represented by the Ten Key Values of the Greens:

Ecological Wisdom	Social Justice
Nonviolence	Grassroots Democracy
Community-based Economics	Decentralization
Respect for Diversity	Feminism
Future Focus	Personal and Global Responsibility

2.2 Methods - This organization may use any and all methods of non-violent social change: direct action, community organizing and education, personal empowerment, issue campaigns, ballot initiatives, and/or electoral campaigns; and their related strategies and tactics.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

3.1 Application for Membership - Membership in the Green Party of Washington State is open to residents of the State of Washington who pay dues, file a waiver, or do work in lieu of payment. A membership applicant shall sign an application form which shall state that the applicant is in general agreement with the Ten Key Values.

3.2 Powers of Members - Any member may add an item to the agenda of the State Convention by consensus or simple majority to the membership present. Any member has a right to vote at the State Convention.

3.3 Ineligibility for Membership - Any person currently serving or seeking an elected position with another political party, including but not limited to precinct committee officer, shall not be eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IV. STATE COORDINATING COUNCIL

4.1 The Function of the Coordinating Council

A) Composition - The State Coordinating Council shall be composed of five members elected proportionately at large at the State Convention, and a Treasurer and a Deputy Treasurer each elected by the membership at the State Convention. Each newly elected state coordinating council shall choose a facilitator, vice facilitator and secretary internally. These internal positions can be rotated at the discretion of the State Coordinating Council throughout their term of service.

Coordinating Council members should reside in at least three different geographical areas in the State. The Coordinating Council should reflect gender and racial diversity.

B) State Conventions - The State Coordinating Council shall plan state conventions and develop the agenda. State Conventions shall be held at least annually.

C) Term of Service - Upon election the State Coordinating Council shall facilitate the work of the Party until the election of their successors. The five at large Coordinating Council members and the Treasurer and Deputy Treasurer shall be elected for a one-year term by the Membership.

D) Legal Board - The State Coordinating Council shall be the legal board of the Green Party of Washington State and must meet at least six times a year.

E) Facilitator - The facilitator shall oversee the distribution of responsibilities of the various state coordinating council members and working groups and convene meetings of the Coordinating Council.

F) Vice Facilitator - In the absence of the Facilitator the Vice Facilitator will carry out the duties of the Facilitator.

G) Secretary - The Secretary serves as principal recorder at meetings of the State Coordinating Council and State Conventions and makes those minutes available to the general membership. The Secretary serves as Party Chair for the purposes of paperwork required by the State that are not the responsibility of the Treasurer.

H) Treasurer - The Treasurer shall be responsible for maintaining the financial records of the Party and for filing reports with the appropriate Washington State offices as required by law in a timely fashion. The Treasurer shall be the banking officer for all funds

at the State level, monitoring income and expenses as budgeted by the State Coordinating Council. This officer shall submit monthly financial statements of receipts and expenditures to the State Coordinating Council, make these statements available at the request of any State Green Party member, and shall submit all reports required by the State of Washington. Upon the conclusion of the term of office, the Treasurer shall turn over all books and reports to the State Coordinating Council and will include a final statement of accounts.

I) Deputy Treasurer - The Deputy Treasurer shall be responsible for assisting with all the duties of the Treasurer. Upon resignation of the Treasurer the Deputy Treasurer becomes the Treasurer. The Facilitator may appoint the Deputy Treasurer as interim Treasurer upon the non-performance of duties by the Treasurer.

J) Budget - It is the responsibility of the State Coordinating Council to prepare an annual budget beginning January 1st of each calendar year.

K) Expenditures - The Treasurer has discretion over day-to-day expenditures within limits set by the State Coordinating Council. All other expenditures are by approval of the State Coordinating Council.

L) Vacancies in State Coordinating Council Positions - Vacancies in the State Coordinating Council shall be filled by appointment by the State Coordinating Council.

M) Other Functional Bodies - The State Coordinating Council may establish other functional bodies and working groups as necessary.

Proposals for new functional bodies shall be submitted to a member of the State Coordinating Council by at least three members and shall clearly define the rationale for, powers of, and accountability standards for the proposed body.

4.2 Removal - Any member of the State Coordinating Council may be suspended by a 2/3rds vote of the State Coordinating Council, to be approved by 3/4 of the Membership. Any member of the Coordinating Council may also be removed for cause by a 3/4ths vote of the Membership.

ARTICLE V. STATE PARTY GENERAL RULES AND PROCEDURES

5.1 Endorsements

A) Candidate Endorsement - Only members of the Green Party of Washington State shall be eligible for endorsement to elected office in Washington State.

B) Presidential Endorsement - Only candidates who are in agreement with the ten key values are eligible for endorsement for President and Vice President of the United States of America.

C) Initiative Endorsement - The State Coordinating Council may utilize mail balloting in order to take a position on a state initiative in a timely fashion.

D) Other Endorsements - The Membership may give the right of decision to the State Coordinating Council.

5.2 Term Limits - No officials of the Green Party of Washington State shall serve on the Coordinating Council for more than three consecutive terms.

5.3 Delegations to other Organizations - Delegations are approved by the consensus of the membership. If consensus cannot be reached then Delegates are elected proportionally. The membership may give the right of decision to the State Coordinating Council.

5.4 Nominations for State Public Office - The Green Party of Washington State shall hold a Nominating Convention in compliance with State law. The threshold for nomination is 3/4 vote of the General Membership present and those voting by absentee ballot. Any person currently serving or seeking an elected position with another political party, including precinct committee officer, shall not be eligible for nomination.

ARTICLE VI. DECISIONS

The Green Party of Washington State shall seek agreement on all decisions, hearing all views and concerns. Where consensus cannot be reached, decisions by all bodies of the Green Party of Washington State shall be approved on a 2/3 vote, except for meeting process motions which shall be approved by a simple majority.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Bylaws may be adopted on a 70% vote of the Membership at a State Convention. Notification of proposed changes to the Bylaws must be fully detailed and sent to all members two weeks before the meeting. Proposed bylaws changes must be sponsored by at least three members and submitted to the Secretary of the State Coordinating Council at least 30 days prior to a State Convention. The Secretary is then responsible for distribution of the proposed bylaws change to the General Membership.

The Socialist Party advocates closing U.S. military bases outside its territory. It advocates a 50% cut in military spending, with training for workers thus displaced. It demands an end of the sanctions against Cuba, Iraq, North Korea, Libya, etc., which have not resulted in positive changes but, particularly in the case of Iraq, have resulted in the deaths of hundreds of thousands of children and elderly.

Our nation has one-quarter of the world's prison population. Often they produce goods, sold on the free market in competition with goods produced by union labor. We have built up a "prison industrial complex." Crime is a crime, and every person should feel secure in his or her community. But prison is also a crime. The police forces in our cities are immune from civilian control and pose a threat to the very people who often suffer the most from crime - the poor and the communities of color. The funds spent on prisons should be spent on preventative measures, better education, and, above all else, a rise in the living standards of the poor.

The term "working poor" is obscene. That anyone in this land should work full time and still be poor is an indictment of our system, which has brought vast wealth to a relative handful. The economic gap between the top and bottom sectors of the population has grown in the past twenty years. The rich are enormously wealthier - but the poor are poorer than they were twenty years ago.

To turn the tide, we must restore high, progressive tax rates on the wealthy and on corporations. Build decent housing for all. Double the minimum wage to make it a living wage. Restore and defend labor's right to organize. Oppose the WTO and other trade alliances that place corporations before people. Create family allowances and provide adequate day care. Create a complete publicly funded health system to cover every American. Rebuild the system of tuition free education. Defend affirmative action. End the failed drug war and treat drugs as medical, not criminal, problems. Guarantee a woman's right to choose. Abolish the death penalty. Support renewable energy. Defend full civil liberties, and begin the process of social ownership and democratic control of the "Fortune 500" and produce for human need, not private profit.
