Mr. Marinelli,

The U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Ohio advised Voinovich for Senate that the District Court had appointed a liquidator for the P.I.E. insurance company and that any reimbursements or repayments by Voinovich for Senate to P.I.E. should be sent to the liquidator. When Voinovich for Senate contacted the liquidator, J. Lee Covington, II, he directed me to pay the funds to "P.I.E. Liquidation Fund" and send them to Mark Wallacek, Attorney at Law, Calfee, Halter and Griswold, 800 Superior Avenue, Suite 1400, Cleveland, Ohio 44114-2688. The reimbursement in the amount of \$15,450.00 was paid in 2002 to the Liquidator and reported in our year-end annual report to the FEC.
