FOURTH CONSENT TO EXTEND THE TIME TO COMMENCE A CIVIL LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTION, SUIT, OR PROCEEDING

In order to provide for a possible resolution of this matter through probable cause conciliation, the Respondent, Keisha Carter, hereby consents to toll the statute of limitations for any civil law enforcement action, suit, or proceeding that the Federal Election Commission might institute in connection with MUR 7678 pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(6) for an additional period of thirty (30) calendar days.

This agreement will extend the time to institute a civil law enforcement action suit for an additional thirty (30) calendar days from the expiration date of the five-year statute of limitations found at 28 U.S.C. § 2462 or any other statute of limitations or repose that may be applicable in this matter. This Consent supplements the Consent to Extend the Time to Commence a Civil Law Enforcement Suit by thirty (30) calendar days, signed by the Respondent on October 20, 2023, a Second Consent to extend the time by twenty-five (25) calendar days, signed by Jeremy T. Berry, the Respondent's counsel, on December 7, 2023, and a Third Consent to extend the time by eighteen (18) calendar days, signed by Jeremy T. Berry on December 19, 2023.

There shall be no additional consent to extend the time to institute a civil law enforcement suit without the written consent of the Respondent.
