Dear Mr. Reese:

On February 25, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Win the Era PAC (formerly Pete for America) and Ed Jordanich in his official capacity as treasurer (the "Committee") and Michael Halle, of a complaint alleging that they had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On March 22, 2022, the Commission considered the complaint and found no reason to believe that the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9 by knowingly accepting an excessive contribution or violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a) by failing to report the contribution. The Commission also found no reason to believe that your client Michael Halle violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9, or 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e) and 11 C.F.R. § 300.61 in connection with the alleged contribution. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.
