Dear Mr. Backer:

On May 31, 2023, the Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations in your client's complaint dated March 24, 2020, and found that on the basis of the information provided in the complaint, and the information provided in the responses, there is no reason to believe Michael R. Bloomberg, Mike Bloomberg, 2020, Inc. and Hayden Horowitz in his official capacity as treasurer, and the DNC Services Corporation/ Democratic National Committee and Virginia McGregor in her official capacity as treasurer violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act") as alleged in the complaint. Accordingly, on May 31, 2023, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
