Dear Mr. Norton:

On March 26, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients Michael R. Bloomberg and Mike Bloomberg, 2020, Inc. and Hayden Horowitz in his official capacity as treasurer of two complaints alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). Copies of the complaints were forwarded to your clients at that time. On June 9, 2020, we received your clients' response to the complaints. On May 31, 2023, the Commission found that there is no reason to believe your clients violated the Act as alleged in the complaints. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in these matters. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
