Dear Mr. Elias, Ms. Lopez, and Ms. Levien:

On September 18, 2020, the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") notified your above-named clients of a complaint alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Copies of the complaint were forwarded to your clients at that time.

Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint and information supplied by you, the Commission, on March 10, 2022, found no reason to believe that your clients violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9 by knowingly accepting excessive in-kind contributions, and closed the file. The Factual and Legal Analysis, which more fully explains the Commission's decision, is enclosed for your information.
